5.2 Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

Combustible. Development of hazardous combustion gases or vapours possible in the event of fire. Fire may cause evolution of HCl (hydrogen chloride), nitrogen oxides.

Suppress (knock down) gases/vapours/mists with a water spray jet. Prevent fire extinguishing water from contaminating surface water or the ground water system.

· Protective equipment:

Stay in danger area only with self-contained breathing apparatus. Prevent skin contact by keeping a safe distance or by wearing suitable protective clothing.

Wear protective gloves and glasses.

Do not allow to enter sewers/ surface or ground water.

Use neutralising agent.

Thorough dedusting.

Observe label pracautions.

- General protective and hygienic measures:

Keep away from foodstuffs, beverages and feed.

· Respiratory protection:

Required when dusts are generated. Recommended Filter type: Filter P 1 (Acc. to DIN 3181) for solid and liquid particles of harmful substances. The entrepeneur has to ensure that maintenance, cleaning and testing of respiratory protective devices are carried out according to the instructions of the manufacturer. These measures have to be properly documented.

Protection of hands:



Protective gloves

The glove material has to be impermeable and resistant to the product/ the substance/ the preparation

Due to missing tests no recommendation to the glove material can be given for the product/ the preparation/ the chemical mixture.

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Selection of the glove material on consideration of the penetration times, rates of diffusion and the degradation

· Material of gloves

The selection of the suitable gloves does not only depend on the material, but also on further marks of quality and varies from manufacturer to manufacturer.

Penetration time of glove material

The exact break through time has to be found out by the manufacturer of the protective gloves and has to be observed.

Full contact:

Glove material: Nitrile rubber Glove thickness: 0.11 mm Break through time: >480 min

Splash contact:

Glove material: Nitrile rubber Glove thickness: 0.11 mm Break through time: >480 min

The protective gloves to be used must comply with the specifications of EC Directive 89/686/EEC and the related standard EN374, for example KCL 741 Dermatril®L (full contact), KCL 741 Dermatril®L (splash contact).

The breakthrough times stated above were determined by KCL in laboratory tests acc. to EN374 with samples of the recommended glove types.

Tightly sealed goggles
